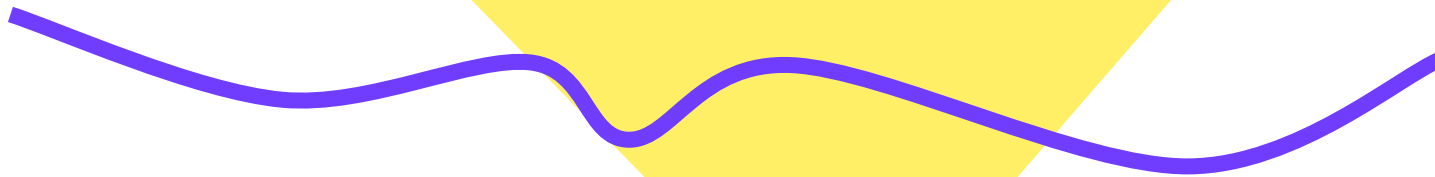


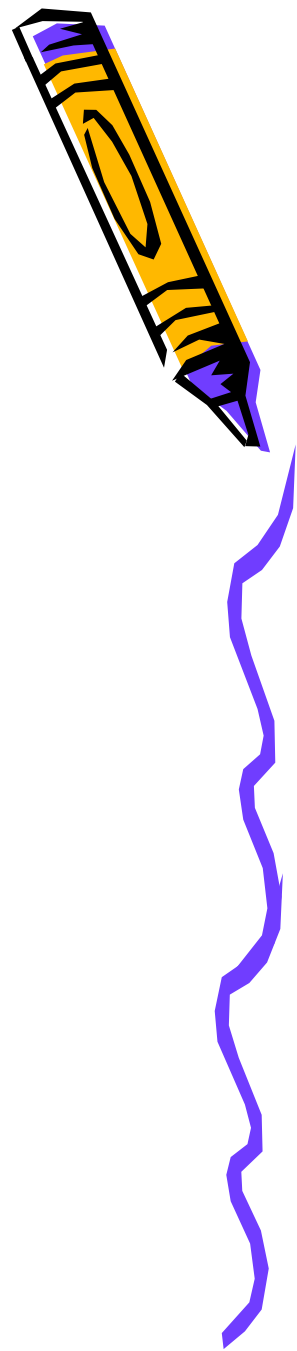

How to access Tapestry – Downloading the App

- Search ‘Tapestry Learning Journal’ in the iTunes App Store (iPhone/iPad)
- Search ‘Tapestry Learning Journal’ in the Google Play Store (Android/Google devices)

- You will receive an email to this email address containing an activation link

- Your password must be at least 10 characters long and include 1 uppercase letter, 1 number and 1 symbol, for example – **St_Johns1**

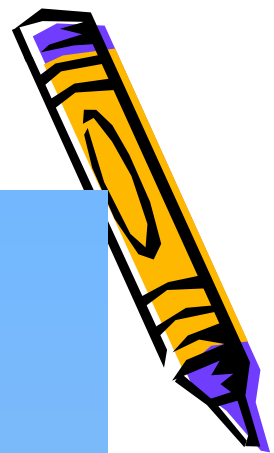

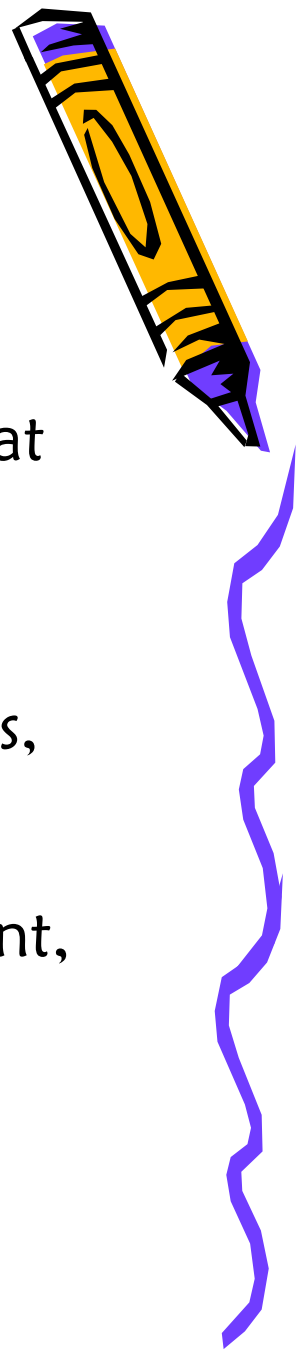

Contributing to Tapestry

- We welcome any contributions of learning that takes place at home such as;
- Examples of writing (names, words, sentences etc.)
- Examples of reading (books, words, road signs, labels etc.)
- Numeracy – counting objects, identifying different shapes or numbers in the environment, writing numbers, measuring.
- Role Play/Being imaginative – taking on a familiar role



- Please comment on whether the task was independent or supported;
- Not all posts need to contain a photograph but please do if possible!
- Posts should have an educational focus and show how your child is extending or applying their learning at home
- You may wish to include photographs or comments about any visits/trips that you have been on such as to the seaside or the farm. These experiences are key to extending your child's interests and imagination. If we are aware of these, we are able to adapt activities to link to them in school.

Commenting on and 'Liking' Posts

- You are able to comment on posts that have been made by a member of staff at school;
- Comments must be appropriate and relate to the observation (please see example);
- You are also able to 'like' posts that are made by a member of staff by clicking the thumbs up symbol;
- Active staff members are also able to comment and like posts (as seen on the previous slide) that have been added from home.
- Please note that parents are only able to view their own child's learning journal. There is no option to view, like or comment on another child in the classes journal.
