Signing In

- The email address you have provided will be used as your 'log in' name
- You will receive an email to this email address containing an activation link
- Here you will be able to set a password
- Your password must be at least 10 characters long and include 1 uppercase letter, 1 number and 1 symbol, for example St_Johns1

- Role Play/Being imaginative taking on a familiar role




- Please comment on whether the task was independent or supported;

- You may wish to include photographs or comments about any visits/trips that you have been on such as to the seaside or the farm. These experiences are key to extending your child's interests and imagination. If we are aware of these, we are able to adapt activities to link to them in school.




Adding a Post from Home


Click 'Add Observation'






Select your child by clicking 'Select Children'

Commenting on and 'Liking' Post
